

My Calling

Since becoming a Christian in April of 1983 and as has been evidenced throughout my personal journey over 45 years, I now understand and embrace the evidence for and conviction of the will God for me in my life.

As God has ordained so many divine appointments throughout my journey, I am convicted of my place in His Kingdom as His ambassador within a royal priesthood, one life at a time, from the inside out. I point to 6 key sections of scripture that highlight this conviction.

- These scriptures of conviction are premised on The Great Commandment found in Matthew 22:34-40 and the Great Commission found in Mathew 28:16-20.
- The first is Philippians 3:13-14. “One thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.”
- The second is that we are to encourage one another as commanded in Hebrews 3:13-14.
- The third is the Parable of the Lost Sheep which is one of the many parables of Jesus. It appears in the Gospels of Matthew (18:12-14) and Luke (16:3-17).
- The fourth is that the Lord looks at the heart... from the inside out as clearly stated in 1 Samuel 16:7.
- The fifth is that I serve as a humbly appointed ambassador according to 2 Corinthians 5:16-21.
- The sixth is 1 Peter 2:9, “But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.”

Therefore, my fully reconciled calling is to serve as a Disciple and Mentor with a focus on Leadership, including but not limited to personal foundation, spiritual growth, relationship enhancement, healthy lifestyle management, life balance, decision-making, and goals.”

- Leadership within my calling is clarified as individual integrity, along with family and business relationships, addressing the many changes in life, with a firm expectation that no one follow me... except as I follow Christ (Colossians 3:23-24, 1 Corinthians 11:1)
